



printGRIP FAQ

What sizes are available?

4" x 21" and 15.5" x 21" are available in all three tack levels. 19.5" x 29" is available in High Tack Yellow only.

How long does printGrip last?

While we have heard success stories of up to 230,000 prints, printGRIPS should easily print 100,000 garments.

What type of garments work with printGRIP?

All types of garments being printed today work with printGRIP. Poly bags, bandanas, and koozies also work with printGRIP.

Are all garment inks currently on the market compatible with printGRIP?

Yes. Plastisol, water-based and silicone ink all work with printGRIP.

Do we apply printGRIP to a bare pallet?

We recommend applying the printGRIP to fresh pallet paper. This allows for easier removal of the printGRIP. When it's at the end of its life, simply peel up the printGRIP with the pallet paper.

How often do we remove lint?

Obviously, every type of garment is different, but as a rule of thumb, we say between 800-1,000 cotton tees and 100-200 fleece garments.

How do we remove lint?

Add one or two drops of dish soap to a bottle of water. Then spray the pallet liberally with this solution and scrub with a scrub pad or brush.

Should we remove lint from the entire printGRIP when cleaning?

There is no need to clean lint off the entire printGRIP. You should only remove lint where print will fall on the shirt. This allows for easier removal of the garment when starting fresh.

What happens when ink transfers through tri-blend garments that are very thin?

We recommend printGRIP Ink Remover available @ WWW.AIMSUPPLY.NET which will remove any type of ink without damaging the printGRIP. If printGRIP Ink Remover is not available, use the least aggressive solvent you have in-house followed by lots of water.

How do we store pallets with printGRIPs when they come off the press?

Simply replace the release paper that comes with the printGRIP or place kitchen parchment paper to protect the printGRIP when stacking pallets off the press.

Do you make custom sizes?

There are manufacturing minimums but feel free to inquire about custom sizes at any time.

Is there anything we can do to reduce tack level after applying printGRIP to a bare pallet?

It always helps to start with fleece garments with new printGRIPS. If this is not possible, you can take scrap fleece and rub it on each pallet. The transferred lint will help the operator get started.
